# **UKMT Junior Maths Challenge**

# Important information Trips, Visits and Events

## **CCF**

On the 12<sup>th</sup> May 2023 Shenfield High CCF took over 30 Year 9 cadet's on their first ever overnight stay to the Army training Centre Pirbright (ATR (P)). This is the home of the British Army's Phase 1 training (basic training) where army cadets conduct a 14 week syllabus taking them from civilians, to a trained soldier. Shenfield High School CCF are the only cadet force in the UK to have been granted access to the Training Centre.



Our cadets were incredibly excited and yet anxious about what lay ahead of them. For the next 24Hrs they would be engaged in military basic tatics including sleeping out in the field under a poncho.

Arriving at ATR (P) the cadets where handed their own bergans (large day sacks) that held the following items in.

- Sleeping bag including an outer water proof cover known as a bivi bag.
- Poncho (camouflaged waterproof sheet) with pegs and bungees
- Water bottle plastic mug and mess tins for cooking
- Webbing and a wooden rifle
- Gortex Jacket just in case it rained

The cadets then had to form into columns of three to insert into the woods within ATR (P) grounds a short walk of 600 meters carrying all their own equipment and the day sacks they had brought themselves with the goodies and treats of sweats and extra warm clothing.



The first lesson the cadets received was how to establish a harbour area and put up their ponchos, which would be the sleeping cover for the night (a thin waterproof sheet bungeed to trees and pegged into the ground, get this wrong and you could wake up to looking at the stars or swimming in a pool of rain).

Once the cadets had set up their ponchos, the next stage was to learn how to cook their own army rations using small cookers and mess tins, boiling up some water, heating up the rations and then using the boiled water to have a hot beverage. Most went for the delicious hot chocolate.

Cadets all fed and watered, harbour established and now reaching towards 22:00 hrs it was time to go into night routine and observe the silence, with owls tweeting and foxes skirmishing around it was not quite the peaceful evening they may have expected.



The following morning saw revile being called at 04:30, break of day light the cadets immediately set to action; cooking their morning breakfast from the 24Hrs ration packs. The harbour area was buzzing with cadets smiling and telling stories of their experience of the previous night: well almost all, some took a little longer to find their way out of their sleeping bags!

Stores packed away, area cleaned up with the odd spare bungee wrapped around the tree needing removing, a very successful first experience, of living in the field out of a bergan, had come to an end. All that remained was the drive home and a very peaceful mini bus full of sleeping cadets.
