

Our UCAS deadline is the 20th December; a large number of students have already applied and started to receive offers. We like to get ahead of the official UCAS deadline, so that students do not have the added pressure on their shoulders over the Christmas break. We will continue to help support students in the New Year, but with the upcoming mock exams we are hopeful the majority of applications will be sent before the 20th December.

Our mock examinations start after Christmas, allowing sufficient content to have been covered since the Y12 end of year examinations. As soon as we have finalised the timings and venues, we will be able to publish the individual timetables to our students before they break up for Christmas.

We have moved back to face-to-face Parents' Evenings, and very much look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on February 15th (further details to follow in due course). Thank you as always for your continued support.

Year 12

We have many trained Peer Mentors that are supporting our students in lower years and we have just started to recruit students that will be able to listen to students in Y7 and Y8 practise their reading.



In the summer term, our Y12 students will sit their Y12 examinations (17th June – 5th July). During this term there will be an introduction to the UCAS process; this is the system that is used to apply to university.

Finally, an incredible 63 students still have 100% attendance to lessons which is great to see!

The Y12 cohort have settled incredibly well into Sixth Form life and we look forward to 2024 and further success.



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
Sixth Formers Learn with the Lords

Charity walk



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Year 10 GCSE Trip: RHS Hyde Hall ổ



National Fish Heroes

The year 10 food students were lucky enough to participate in the National Fish Heroes scheme this term. We won a delivery of 8kg of fresh rope grown mussels from Offshore Shellfish. This is a scheme supported by the Fishmongers company and DFDS delivery. It was organised by The Food Teachers centre UK and is all about educating students on sustainable food sources from the sea like mussels.

All the year 10 Food students were able to gain first-hand experience in selecting, cleaning and preparing mussels for cooking as well as being able to try out 4 very different methods of cooking the mussels. This sort of practical experience is absolutely invaluable in widening their knowledge and understanding of sustainability, provenance and food preparation as well as giving them exposure to foods they would otherwise not try! We had a number of converts to eating mussels as a result!


