News from the Headteacher

It has felt that no time at all has passed since I last wrote to you in our school newsletter; this last half term has flown by in a flurry of examinations, sporting events, performances and an array of extracurricular activities.

It is usual, within the final newsletter of the year, to highlight some stand-out events from the school year. However, with so much to choose from this year I would find that difficult and would be sure to forget or offend someone! I will let the contents of this newsletter speak for me.

Suffice to say, your children have been fabulous. They have participated in their learning and in the wider school life that is on offer; they have contributed to the school and the wider community through student leadership and individual character, and they have been good people to be around. It is those students that put effort into school that get the most out.

Over the past week there have been daily communications coming out to you that are reinforcing our basic expectations in readiness for September but also explaining changes to our policies on homework and assessment. If you haven't read these communications, then I urge you to do so but in summary; PREP will be replaced by homework from September 2024. This decision has been made following queries and feedback from parents that PREP has not supported a positive independent work ethic amongst their children and that parents struggle to support school policy as PREP can be seen as voluntary. I agree with this view and so we return to the concept of homework, something that is straightforward and easy to understand by students, parents and staff.

We have also made changes to our assessment procedures so that students and parents have clearer information on the progress the students are making in different subjects. We will be using GCSE and A level grades to report assessments in KS4 and KS5 respectively, again helping students and parents to better understand their academic progress.

I am pleased to report that we are fully staffed with qualified and specialist staff across the curriculum in September and the new staff will be introduced to you in September. I wish to thank all the staff, whatever their role, for the work they have put into Shenfield High School this past year and I wish those colleagues leaving us to take up new posts or completely new adventures the very best of luck. There is one member of staff leaving us this year that I feel deserves an individual tribute.

Mr John Ninian has served the teaching profession for fifty years and in that time has inspired many individuals, some of whom have gone into teaching as a direct result of that inspiration. We have been fortunate to have had John at Shenfield High School for twenty-two of those years and in that time, he has been a leader and a mentor to many staff and an impactful teacher for many students. We know he leaves teaching with a heavy heart, but we wish him all the very best as he retires.

Thank you for the support you show Shenfield High School and I wish you and your loved ones a safe, happy and sunny (fingers crossed) summer break.



Year 10 Careers Day with Practice Interview Day

At Shenfield High School on Tuesday 9th July, the Careers Department successfully ran the Year 10 Careers Day.

Thank you to our students who fully embraced the day in their interview outfits and professional manner.

The practice interview sessions were run by our dedicated employer volunteers who gave up their time to support the students, giving them a 30 minute practice interview. The experience and feedback students receive from their practice interviews will be invaluable as they prepare for their first "real" interviews.

Students also took part in an interactive enterprise task, delivered to students by an external company, Bright Futures. Students worked in teams taking part in a number of practical activities aimed at developing their enterprise skills and their understanding of the skills and qualities which are sought by employers.

Finally, students worked individually and in groups, to consider and explore questions about themselves and their future, known as their Life Spaces. This was run by The Brentwood Schools Christian Worker Trust. This gave students space for reflection to think about themselves, deeper life questions and future career choices.

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Year 12 visit to Oxford University

A group of Year 12 Students visited Oxford University recently and were introduced to the educational opportunities and facilities available to undergraduate students.




They were welcomed by the Master of St. Peter's College and outreach tutors who gave insight to the colleges, the admissions process and interview experience, dispelling some myths about Oxbridge generally and encouraging state school students to apply.

Students actively took part in an interesting academic lecture on biodiversity, habitat fragmentation and eco-system restoration in Chile.

Q and A sessions with current undergraduate students allowed our students an insight to the academic and social life at Oxford, including fun events organised within the JCR, the social hub in college.

Lunch in the college dining room was followed by a tour of University College, the oldest college in Oxford, steeped in tradition and history, as well as the sight of new student accommodation buildings.





David Churchill, governor at Shenfield High School, hosted our visit and led a tour of the town to conclude the day giving students information about university buildings and famous landmarks such as the Bridge of Sighs, Sheldonian Theatre and Bodleian Library which offers the largest library service in the UK.

Students said they felt inspired and commented they had thoroughly enjoyed the day.

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Year 9 Learning Enrichment Activities Day

We were lucky enough to be invited, once again, to attend a Learning Enrichment Activities Day (LEAP) at Brentwood School.

It was an all day event designed to enhance skills in problems solving, critical thinking and public speaking for academically able students in Year 9. Students participated in a series of activities designed to stretch and challenge them.

The students attended workshops with students from other local schools on; critical thinking skills, where students were challenged in groups to solve a series of higher level thinking problems; psycho behavioural analysis, where students looked at case studies designed to stimulate students to question the 'easy answers'; problem solving skills, where students again worked in groups to complete tasks requiring teamwork and mental agility and a biological investigation, during which students learnt how to take fingerprints from a crime scene.

Students also attended a talk on how the universities of Oxford and Cambridge select and mentally challenge students and finally students wrote and delivered a talk about a subject of their choosing to the rest of the group.

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Shenfield Combined Cadet Force (CCF)

Defence School of Policing and Guarding

Cadets from Years 10-13 were recently invited to attend a team building and command task activity day at The Defence School of Policing and Guarding. Shenfield High School are the first CCF in the country to have been offered this unique opportunity. On a bright and sunny day in late June two minibuses departed school shortly after 07:00 enroute to Fareham in Hampshire. Lots of very excited and talkative cadets settled quickly into the long journey. I mention this as it features again at the end of the article!

We were met at DSPG by Warrant Officer (WO) Daniel Woolridge who retains responsibility for all things 'fitness' at the UKs main MOD police training centre, were at any one time up to 500 service personnel from the tri services are undergoing specific policing and guarding training. The cadet's morning activities focused more on the cerebral challenges of working as a team to overcome various problems and situation, these included, blind folded mine fields, tent building (without instructions or diagrams) sign making for viewing from aircraft, stretcher building (with only two poles and one long rope), traversing 'swamps' using blocks and planks. Whilst most of these may seem easy, it becomes so much harder when only one person can give instructions for each exercise !!! as you will know keeping young adults silent can often be the biggest challenge!

However, they quickly learned that fewer voices provide a quicker way of achieving success. All the tasks were timed, with points awarded based on speed and being completed successfully inside a maximum ten-minute timeframe.

WO2 Woolridge had organised for the cadets to purchase lunch in the main camp messing hall, which for many was a new experience in an operational military setting.

The afternoon's activities were of a more physical nature, starting with the 'trim trail'. This comprised approximately 1km of track around the fence line of the camp, which was interspersed with various physical exercises, including angled sit ups, monkey bars, chin ups, balance beams, low climbing obstacles etc, all to be completed at a medium paced jog. The cadets also completed a low ropes obstacle course that included the need to get from one end to the other without falling in the 'boiling lava', whilst carrying a plank of wood that was needed to access and exit at both ends of the obstacle.

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As the activity day came towards its close, it became very apparent that the early start and extensive range of physical challenges the cadets had faced, was beginning to take its toll. The flushed faces and reduced chatter were a clear indication that WO2 Woolridge had truly delivered an exceptional day of activities that the cadets had enjoyed and leant so much from; about themselves and the overwhelming positive value of working collectively as a team in order the overcome problems and challenges.

We have already started to plan a repeat of this activity and with luck will be able to build upon it by including other elements of cadet life. We are indebted to WO2 Woolridge for allowing us the opportunity to be the first of hopefully many more CCFs that will benefit from this kind of integration with the armed forces and their extensive repertoire of resources.

As we began our long journey home the level of chatter on the minibuses subsided significantly to the point that many took the opportunity to nap, or at least until we made the obligatory stop at the 'Golden Arches'.

Our next adventure will be summer camp, which we will report on in the first autumn newsletter. Until then, we hope you have a great summer break and hopefully some pleasant weather. We are looking forward to welcoming our new Year 9 cadets in September.

In addition to hearing these speeches, Sixth Formers also had a chance to pose questions to the panel, covering various topics, from the Israel-Hamas War to the cost-of-living crisis.

The debate gave students a front-row seat on how general elections operate in the UK and furthered their understanding of political parties ahead of their mock exams.

Parallel to real-life events, students across the school took part in their very own Mock General Election on Thursday, July 4th.

After watching a short presentation explaining each party's manifesto, students voted for who they thought should represent the constituency of Brentwood and Ongar and run the government of the United Kingdom.

- A manifesto is a list of promises that parties make, explaining what they aim to do if they are elected to govern



The results differed across each year group. However, with a comparatively higher turnout than other year groups, Years 7 and 8 ultimately secured a victory for the Labour Party, commanding 39% of the vote, more than any other party.

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Cricket

The Shenfield Cricket season has been one of the most successful of recent years. Our U13 and U15 girls' teams both made their respective County finals (playing July 11th at Billericay CC) and the U15 girls also finished second in the Essex 'Chance to Shine' softball competition.

The U12 boys have arguably been the most prolific team in the school. Their captain, Robin S, has scored 3 unbeaten 50's and an unbeaten century already this season and he has been well supported by his team with the bat and ball. Robin is the first Year 7 in Shenfield cricket history to score a century!

The U13 boys lost their first game of the season and have never looked back. They have made huge progress beating KEGS, St Martins, Moulsham, Coopers and Hall Mead on their way to the Mid Essex and Essex Cup finals.

Frankie N and Zach H have been key players but other crucial contributions with the bat have come from Casper N, Finley F, Ollie G and Ethan C. Max G and Josh P (before his foot injury) have also been standout bowlers in most games.

Our U15 boys are also undefeated this year though they have several games to squeeze in before the end of the season. Hopefully they will be able to reach their third Essex Cup cricket final in 4 years.

The U18 boys have played 12 fixtures this summer and enjoyed a mixed season against quality private school opposition.

Gus P has been the key allrounder in the team but the most memorable performance of the season was Arjun B's century against the MCC. Arjun finished on 118 against a top quality adult side. Arjun and Callum B played their last game for Shenfield against an Australian touring side. Both players have made huge progress and have been superb ambassadors for Shenfield Cricket over the last 2 years since they joined the school for our 6th form and the cricket academy programme.

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Athletics

The Shenfield High School athletics season has been one of the most successful in the school's history.

At the District Championships our Year 7 boys, Year 7 girls and Year 8 boys teams all won their respective titles and we finished second overall by just a few points. Next year will be an all out effort to claim the overall title which we have not won for 20 years.

There were so many superb individual performances with school athletics records broken by Will H (Y8 boys 1500m), Tom A (Y8 boys hurdles, Ellie G (Y9 girls 1500m), Steph S (Y9 girls 300m school and district record), Will B (Y8 boys Hammer) and Violet W(Y10 girls Hammer).

In the ESAA Track and Field Cup we entered all 4 teams, U13 boys and girls and the U15 boys and girls. All 4 teams qualified for the regional B finals, just missing out on the Regional A finals to the very big athletics schools that either have their own tracks, throwing cages and/or pole vault beds, which can make a big difference to the team scores.

At the Regional Finals we had six athletes who scored over 40 points. Emannuel O scored a remarkable 50 points, the best ever from any Shenfield student (he competed in the 200m and triple jump). Tom A scored 46 points in the hurdles and high jump; Steph S (42 points in the 300m and High Jump); Will H (42 points from 1500m and High Jump); Amira K (41 points in 1500m and relay) and Poppy H (40 points in 200 and Long Jump).

Collectively, both the U13 boys team and the U15 boys came first out of the 10 other schools in attendance, while the U15 girls finished second.

Huge "well done" to all of our athletes who have worked so hard in clubs before and after school as well as training outside of school to allow for this considerable success.
