ESAA Cross Country

Our U13 boys, U13 girls and U15 boys all reached the regional finals of the ESAA Cross Country cup after excellent team performances in the county round at Campion school.



The regional finals were held at Felsted School where our teams were competing to make a National final for only the second time in Shenfield High School history.

Our U13 boys had won at Campion so were our best hope. Zac Thomas lead our team home to qualify for the National finals along with Southend High School for Boys and Eastwood.

The boys and their parents all joined us up in Leeds on the Friday night as we prepared for the race at midday on Saturday 12th November.

Zac Thomas got an excellent start and was running at the front of the race alongside the best club runners in England. Zac went on to finish 11th out of 170 runners with Casper Norris (Year 7) an excellent 51st position, Alf Carter was 61st with Louis Wilkinson our final scoring runner in 83rd. This meant the team finished 12th out of the 28 teams present which beats the 14th position the only other time we made a National final back in 2019.

Mr Sapsford and Mr Clayton were so proud of the boys efforts. "They have been great ambassadors for our school and are all so driven to succeed. We are sure these boys will be working hard on their fitness to have another opportunity at breaking in to the top 10 schools in England next year."

Skiing

Year 9 student, Tristan Hersant, took part in the Southern Region National Schools Championship, for skiing, on Saturday 12th November and came in 3rd place, representing Shenfield High School.



As a result of this he has been selected to be part of the NSSA (National Schools Snowsports Association) UK Alpine Squad.

Football

The Shenfield football season has started with lots of teams enjoying exciting cup runs. The U12 boys, U13 boys Elite, U13 girls, U14 girls U14 boys U15 and U16 girls have all managed to reach the last 32 schools in England (5th round) of the ESFA National cups. We also have the U12 B U14 B U15 & U16 Boys B teams all in their respective National cups.

To have so many school teams progressing this far is testament to the hard work the players put in to their skills and fitness at both in school and out of school training sessions. The U12 boys have been especially prolific. After a bye in the first round they have scored

28 goals in 4 National cup games conceding only 3. They had been drawn away for every round but when they play the 6th round (last 32) after Christmas they will look forward to a home draw for a place in the last 16 of the 636 teams that entered!

The U13 girls are seeking to defend the National title they won last year and also have a home draw for their last 32 game against Grey Court School, Richmond.

Best of luck to all our Shenfield teams for their respective National and County Cup games after Christmas. It is never easy getting to a National Cup final and for most schools it happens once in a lifetime. We hope we can continue our record as a school that regularly reaches National Cup finals, we will certainly help prepare the players to be at their best and consider the small details that make the big difference in the later rounds of these competitions.

Athletics

This term our athletes have competed in two indoor events with considerable success.

The U14 boys and girls reached the finals of the Lea Valley Competition where the girls, led by Fisola Fagbadegun, finished an incredible 2nd place from most of the best Athletics schools in the really strong South East region.



The Year 7 and 8 girls also won their respective Brentwood Indoor Athletics competitions last week. St Martins teams were the only other school but even they were way off the pace of our girls who especially dominated the track events.

The hard work our athletes put in especially at JSA strength and conditioning sessions as well as the cross-country morning training sessions has added to the fitness levels of our athletes this year. We never get bored of pointing out that hard work pays off, because it is so true, in both sport and life!
