Our Year 13 senior student leaders have made an excellent start to the year, settling quickly into their new leadership roles.


Abbie and Owen represented the Sixth Form brilliantly at the recent Open Evening, delivering confident and inspiring speeches to prospective students and their families.

Sports Leaders


This term has seen our Sports Leadership team grow to 65 pupils across Year 7-9. They have already supported 10 events this half term including football, gymnastics, cross country and archery.

World Challenge 2025 eSwatini & Kruger National Park



15 Shenfield students headed to eSwatini just before the end of the summer term to take part in an opportunity of a lifetime. After 24 hours of travelling, the group started the trip with an unplanned detour to a hostel in Johannesburg before catching a bus across to eSwatini the next morning.

The group settled into their first campsite before visiting the Mantenga Cultural Village to learn about the country's traditional homesteads. The group then travelled on to their community initiative at a Neighbourhood Care Point, which provides food, shelter and childcare for the local community.

Throughout the next few days, the group helped to dig a trench up to a water source to provide clean water for the NCP, engaging and working with the local residents as well as enjoying a 4-3 win in an evening football match against the locals. The students finished up their time at the NCP with a traditional Swazi meal before heading to their trekking phase.

The Ngwempisi River & Ridge trek involved 3 nights and 4 days of trekking and camping in the African wilderness.

The team camped by riverbeds, in rock lodges and did some wild camping in between their tough and treacherous trekking, as well as bonding over the evening campfires.

The expedition wrapped up with two nights and three days in Kruger National Park, with early morning, whole day and late-night safaris to see all the incredible wildlife as well as a slap-up group meal to end the trip on a high. After another day of travel the students, all reflected on what an incredible adventure they'd enjoyed as Mr Chapman and Miss Matthews handed them back over to their parents!

An Inspiring Visit from Performance Poet Kimba





CCF Summer Camp


CCF Summer Camp – Warcop, Cumbria (End of Summer Term 2025)

Of course, no CCF road trip would be complete without the traditional stop at the "Golden Arches," providing some much-needed fuel for the long journey!

Upon arrival, cadets were allocated to their Army billets before embarking on a full week of challenging and rewarding activities. We were blessed with fantastic weather throughout the week, which made the most of the stunning Cumbrian scenery and provided the perfect backdrop for an unforgettable camp experience. One of the major highlights was the live firing range day, where every cadet achieved highly respectable scores. Special congratulations go to Senior NCO Luke, who earned the difficult and prestigious Marksman qualification. All cadets have since been awarded the relevant weapons badge, which they can now proudly display on their CCF uniforms.

Another standout event was the Adventurous Training (AT) day, which pushed cadets well out of their comfort zones. The day featured a range of physically and mentally demanding activities — including some that tested a few cadets' fear of heights — but all showed outstanding courage and determination. The day also included a short bushcraft session, Bear Grylls-style, where cadets learned practical survival skills and got hands-on experience with classic outdoor techniques.

The traditional overnight exercise formed the culmination of the week. Designed to test leadership, fieldcraft, and resilience, the exercise saw cadets sleeping out in the forest and cooking their own meals using army rations. This year, the contingent was split into three sections and tasked with conducting a reconnaissance of a mock "enemy" position — a purpose-built assault house located on exposed high ground and featuring its very own helipad, making it even more challenging to approach undetected.

In a tactical twist, Capt Brooks and Maj Maynard were directed to assign less experienced cadets to lead the reconnaissance, giving them an invaluable opportunity to develop leadership skills under pressure. The teams gathered intelligence on enemy numbers, vehicles, and weapon systems before leading a dawn assault the following morning. Under the command of their junior NCOs, the attack was executed with precision and determination — and we are pleased to report that the 'enemy' was successfully neutralised and the objective fully secured.

The week also included a demanding physical training day, featuring a replica field gun the challenge inspired by famous Royal Tournament Field Gun competition between annually Devonport and **Portsmouth** who competed for the Brickfield Trophy. The cadets enjoyed the experience so much that we are now exploring ways to raise funds — around £4,000 – to purchase our own field gun and limber, with the aim of turning it into an inter-house competition in future across the wider school community. Any offers of sponsorship, introductions to corporate funding or support would be greatly appreciated.

After an action-packed and thoroughly rewarding week, the contingent returned to school tired but proud. We also bid farewell to our Battery Sergeant Major Stephanie and Regimental Sergeant Major Nathan, who leave at the end of Sixth Form to pursue careers within the public services. We thank them both for their dedication, leadership, and commitment to the CCF, and wish them every success for the future.

The camp concluded with the traditional end-of-camp briefing from the Camp Commander and RSM. We were delighted to hear that our very own Daisy received outstanding praise, being described as "the best section commander the training team and RSM had seen over the entire three-week period." Considering the camp involved more than 1,400 cadets from across the South East, this is a truly remarkable achievement — and one that reflects the professionalism and teamwork of our entire contingent.

It was, without doubt, a week to remember — blessed with great weather, breathtaking scenery, and the perfect mix of challenge, achievement, and camaraderie — a fitting way to end the Summer Term 2025.

Maaryah's family splits, her home moves from Dubai to Essex, and she stands out at her new school, especially as the only hijab. Between friendship troubles, new routines, and trying to stay true to herself, she learns that "fitting in" might mean standing out in all the right ways. A heartfelt, funny, and sharp book all about identity, family, and courage.

And one for the grown ups Book Review: Pick a Colour by Souvankham Thannavongsa



Set over one summer day in a small, Canadian nail salon, this novel peels back the layers of everyday lives: the customers, the staff, their expectations, their regrets. The salon is owned by Ning, a retired boxer, and staffed by workers who all share the name "Susan" — a symbolic touch that raises questions about identity, anonymity, and how we present ourselves. Through subtle detail, internal monologue, and quiet tension, Thammavongsa explores labour, migration, beauty, and what it means to be seen (or unseen).

Their dedication, energy, and enthusiasm continue to impress, and we look forward to showcasing their hard work in the Summer Showcase!




Singing Focus
