
#### **World Challenge 2025**

A group of 15 students from Year 10, 11 & 13 all headed off to eSwatini on Sunday to take part in an opportunity of a lifetime.

The students arrived in Johannesburg and transferred to Ezulwini Valley to begin their expedition. They have spent the first couple of days orientating and acclimatising themselves to their new environment, including a walk of Sheba's Breast Trail to warm their legs up in preparation for their trek later in the trip.

As part of the expedition, students are involved in helping with a community initiative, in this case it is setting up a water system at a local Neighbourhood Care Point, who provide essential food, education and medical support for children in rural communities. They'll also get lots of opportunities to engage with the local community with homestead visits, language lessons, dance shows and football matches with the locals.

They'll soon be heading to the big challenge of the trip, the Ngwempisi River & Ridge trek, involving three nights and four days of trekking and camping in the African wilderness. They'll be hoping to snap some sensational shots of the gorge from the Etjebovu Viewpoint, as well as bonding over the evening campfires. To cap off the trip, the team will return to South Africa and head to the incredible Kruger National Park to enjoy the authentic safari experience, enjoying the wildlife during daytime, sunset and nighttime. The team will get together for a last group meal to reminisce about what an incredible time they've had before heading back home and sharing all their stories with their family and friends.






A special well done and congratulations also to the historians of Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 who have all completed their exams in recent weeks! We are very proud of you.




#### **Leavers Parade**


deserved moment in the spotlight - showcasing the inclusive and collaborative spirit at Shenfield High School.

### **Shenfield Cricket Continues to Excel**

Shenfield has long been known for its commitment to providing excellent opportunities for cricket and nothing has changed this year.

We were again identified as a Top 100 School for Cricket by 'The Cricketer' Magazine and the following achievements are testament to the scale of the cricket opportunities at Shenfield.

In February half term we took our Post-16 Cricket Academy squad to Cape Town, South Africa, where they played against 5 elite Private schools and managed to win 3 of these games.

Our U18 girls cricketers also enjoyed a preseason festival at Bradfield College, a school that has made 3 National finals for cricket with their U18 girls in the last 2 years. Both tours were a huge success in terms of the enjoyment had and the progress made with cricket skills.

Girls cricket at Shenfield has indeed enjoyed another great summer since the Bradfield Tour. The U17 girls progressed to the Essex 'Open' Cup final where they met Brentwood School. Captain Millie R top scored with 20, but when she was caught our run rate dropped and we could not keep up with the required rate so finished as runners-up.

The U15 girls met Chelmsford CHS in their respective state school competition. Our girls lost early wickets to their Essex bowler before Ellie G and Isla F put on a 50 partnership. When the Essex bowler came back on, she ripped through the tail taking 6 wickets for just 10 runs to restrict us to 91 after 20 overs. CCHS lost 4 wickets in their reply but were always ahead of the run rate before winning the game in the 15th over. To be Essex runners-up with only 2 girls that play club cricket is a quite remarkable achievement.

Our U13 girls have had a fantastic summer. They enjoyed a great day out at Essex CCC early in the term which included watching Mady V play for Durham against Essex. As well as seeing Mady take wickets and score runs they also had a coaching session in the indoor school. This day had a huge impact on galvanising the squad and helping hone their skills. They lost a narrow game to Bancrofts in the 'Open' Cup then won every other game to claim the Mid Essex title against Chelmsford CHS and the Essex 'State School' Cup title with an emphatic performance against Coopers. In both finals the girls bowled first and were on point with their line and lengths. In the Mid Essex final we had to chase 59 in 15 overs. Sophie B opened the batting and got us off to a great start, she retired when she passed 15 runs and all other girls contributed to see us to the target with 10 balls to spare. In the Essex final Isabella C took 2 wickets in the first over to dismiss 2 County players from Coopers. Paige H then took 3 wickets in one over before Scarlett E took a further 2 wickets. We ended up bowling Coopers out for just 34 runs and chased the target down in just 4 overs, the most emphatic Essex Cricket final win in Shenfield Cricket history.

The boys cricket season saw our U17 boys progress through 3 rounds of the National Cup, including a memorable win over Bancrofts. Haileybury proved too strong in the next round but we learned loads in that cup run. The U18 side beat Bancrofts in an early game before getting knocked out of the National T20 by Forest School, falling just 5 runs short of a huge target of 212.

The 1st XI played the MCC in our annual all day fixture on Sunday June 22nd at Shenfield CC. Luke W was the pick of the bowlers taking 3 wickets as we restricted the MCC to 235-6. Ben P and Dan G got us off to a solid start but skipper Gus P came in, his aggressive batting helping to change the tempo of the game. He scored 66 from just 38 balls before he was caught on the boundary.

When 6 were required we lost Harry D so Cian D came to the crease amid scenes that compared to Headingly 2023! Thankfully Luke mirrored Ben S' miracle innings, Luke finished unbeaten on 67 as we reached 236-9 scrambling 2 runs to get us over the line.

The U14 boys cricket side managed to reach the finals day in the Essex Open Cup having enjoyed 3 good wins to get there. We had to play Forest School in the morning game hosted at Forest. Despite Robin taking a sharp slip catch off of George B's bowling to remove their number 1 bat we struggled to keep the run rate down and had to chase a target that proved too much. Robin S has scored so many runs this season but an incredible catch on the boundary saw him dismissed for 10. Reuben H batted well to top score but ultimately it was a great experience to compete with an excellent side. The Year 9 boys are also unbeaten in the Mid Essex league to retain the title won last year.

The U15 boys reached the final of the Essex 'State School' Cup and face Westcliff GS. This final was postponed initially and was then played on 9th July. This squad have been well led by Joey N and have come through 4 games to compete in this final. Robin S (Year 8) is the teams highest scorer across those games. Robin's highlight for the U15's was a superb 121 not out from just 52 balls against St Martins. In that game George B scored 69 as they put on a school record of 183 for the 3rd wicket. In the final Westcliff won the toss and batted first.

They got off to a good start and it was not until George B joined the bowling attack that the game swung back in Shenfield's favour. George took 2 early wickets to remove the set batters before Mytchell M took 2 wickets himself. Frankie N also bowled well and took 1 wicket for just 21 runs from his 4 overs. Shenfield had to chase154 and lost Will T-S early. Joey N joined Robin and they put on a superb partnership to take the game away from Westcliff. Robin ended up on 72 not out and Joey 58 (partnership of 140) before George came out to hit the winning runs in the 15th over of the 20 over game. They join the U13 girls as Essex Champions.

Meanwhile our U12 boys squad has been well led by Alfie B. This team is pretty inexperienced but they have progressed loads across the season. Many of the players have now joined cricket clubs and this progress was seen when we beat a strong KEGS side by 8 wickets in the Mid Essex League. That same KEGS team had knocked us out of the Essex Cup at the start of the cricket season.
