#### British Army Officer Scholarship -RSM Hambidge

A British Army Officer Scholarship has been awarded to Combined Cadet Force Cadets Regimental Sergeant Major David Hambidge.

The scholarship includes £3,000 in the recipient's final school year, plus a confirmed Army bursary, worth up to £7,000, if they choose to study a recognised degree at a UK university it qualifies Army scholars to apply for an additional Army bursary of up £75,000.

The scholarship awards young people with proven leadership potential a place to train at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst and later commission into the British Army as Officers. Candidates are assessed across several areas including, physical fitness, planning, teamwork and leadership skills. They also must pass a series of challenging interviews from senior army officers and write an essay as part of the intensive selection process.

In the citation, David is 'recognised as possessing exceptional leadership potential' and has secured a confirmed place to train as an Army Officer with the Army giving them financial and career support through school and university.

Lt Simon Brooks, Contingent Commander (CCF) said:

David has been a valued members of the CCF and is now the most senior rank a cadet can achieve, leading the younger cadets. Congratulations to David on his fantastic achievement. The CCF and the wider Shenfield High School are very proud of his achievement.

David said:

I couldn't have achieved this without the support of the entire CCF team and my fellow cadets who have helped me prepare. Particularly Lt Brooks and Major Maynard. Without the CCF, I would not have had the opportunity to find my passion for the Army and pursue a future career. I have only just been promoted to RSM and I look forward to helping develop the Army section and younger cadets this year. I have chosen to follow an engineering career and feel that my passion for this subject and military life is best met as an officer, I intend to join The Corps of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (REME) once I pass out from Sandhurst Military academy.

Shenfield School Headteacher, Miss Clare Costello, presented David with his certificates, from the President of the Army Officer Selection Board, and Army Scholar badges for his CCF uniform. She congratulated RSM Hambidge on his fantastic achievement and acknowledged the incredible opportunities CCF offers all cadets from years 9-13 at Shenfield High School. She went on to say Shenfield High School CCF has proved time and time again to provide a fantastic opportunity to develop leadership, discipline, self-reliance, confidence and numerous other soft skills outside of the traditional classroom setting that will benefit our students as they progress through higher education and ultimately onto employment across all career choices, as demonstrated by RSM Hambidge.

#### **Borneo - World Challenge**

Students from Year 11, 12 and 13 had the trip of a lifetime at the end of the summer term last year.

After an epic 20+ hours of flights the students acclimatized in Kota Kinabalu, exploring the local street markets for souvenirs and tasting the local delicacies (along with the usual burger and chips!) After a good night's sleep, the group spent some time on the idyllic Dinawan Island, relaxing and paddle boarding in the sea. After a slow and relaxed start the real challenge began with their trek phase, climbing Mount Kinabalu.

Trekking up the mountain over 2 days before a fitful night's sleep ahead of the final push to the summit at 4,095m and the usual photoshoot and celebrations. What goes up, must come down and despite the weary legs all the students made it down the mountain to the hostel and a slap-up meal refuel followed by a well-earned nap before moving to our next destination.

It was from the mountain to the jungle for the students travelling by coach across the country to hot and humid jungle setting of Kinabatangan. Staying in the water top chalets and engaging in the reforestation of an area devastated by illegal felling of trees and helping to bring wildlife back to the area. Culminating in a 2-night stay in hammocks falling asleep to the noises of the jungle the students made their way back to camp to take part in a local ceremony, representing the school and accepting gifts from a nearby settlement visiting to look at sustainable communities.

After enjoying a (non-river water) shower for the first time in 3 days it was time for the students to begin the last leg of their expedition, travelling by bus to Sandakan to enjoy some R&R by the pool and visiting the local wildlife sanctuaries for orangutans and sun bears. The highlight for many being the close encounter with a wild orangutan on the final morning before heading to the airport and the long journey home back to their parents with a whole raft of stories and souvenirs to share with their loved ones.
