

Exceeding Expectations Postcards


At Shenfield High School, we are thrilled to have introduced the Exceeding Expectations Postcard; a brand-new initiative to celebrate the incredible efforts of our students.

Jack Petchey Awards

We would like to congratulate the winners of the September, October and November Jack Petchey Award for their incredible contribution to the Shenfield High School community.

Winning students are awarded a grant that they nominate to be spent on an activity they feel will benefit the school and wider community.

Regimental Sergeant Major Nathan has chosen to spend his grant on a training defibrillator that can be used to demonstrate the safe and accurate use of defibrillators both in school and the wider community as our cadets move through their post school life and into either further education or the working world. Every year approximately 30,000 people in the UK suffer an out of hospital heart attack.

Staff Sergeant Alfie has used his allocation of funding to purchase much needed baby sized resuscitation training dolls. The purchase of these items is particularly relevant given the number of our cadets that have younger siblings and close family relatives and friends.

Thanks to the generous donation from Lily D to the art department, they were able to purchase a large quantity of high quality watercolour palettes to support year 10 and 11 students in producing the highest quality of work. Lily's generosity has positively impacted all GCSE art students.

We are incredibly proud of our students and we look forward to congratulating our future winners of this prestigious award.






Bookbuzz Success

UK Bebras Challenge

We were very excited for the first time to have all of our key stage 3 students take part in the UK Bebras Challenge. This is organised by the Raspberry Pi Foundation and delivered in partnership with the University of Oxford.

The Challenge introduces computational thinking to students worldwide. This exciting challenge takes place in schools, under the supervision of teachers, over a two-week period every November. Last year, over 3 million students from more than 80 countries participated!

Each participant had 45 minutes to tackle a series of interactive tasks, designed to encourage logical thinking and problem-solving skills appropriate for their age group. The challenge is conducted online, and tasks are marked automatically by our competition system. The tasks are designed to allow every student the opportunity to showcase their potential, whether they excel in maths or computing, or not.

We are extremely proud of all our students and especially those who achieved gold and distinctions across all the year groups. Our current year 7 and 8 will have another chance next year and the new year 7 cohort joining in September 2025.

Geography Fieldwork

This half term, year 8 students have been studying a weather and climate unit, a hugely relevant and topical body of work in the light of the recent COP summit in Azerbaijan and the flooding caused by storm Bert.

As part of this unit, each class conducted a mini weather survey around the school. This has enabled them to experience a geographical enquiry beyond the confines of the classroom and has been a great success. Mrs Hampton has done an excellent job organising and resourcing the study and the year group has created some outstanding work and conducted themselves extremely well whilst they traversed the site and collected their data.

The students went to a selection of sites around the school where they recorded wind speed, light levels, temperature and measured cloud cover. The pupils then returned to the classroom to write up conclusions on the variations on climate around the school and evaluated their work, and results.

The results varied day by day and the weather was kind, so all in all a successful and rewarding experience for everyone.

British Armed Forces Guest Speakers

In November, we were lucky enough to invite Carol Chambers and Neale Piper into Shenfield High School. Carol and Neale are both former serving officers in the British Armed Forces.

Carol, who was in the Army, reached the rank of Leftenant Colonel for the Ministry of Defence, is also a qualified nurse and midwife who worked in both the NHS and the military medical core.

Neale, who was in the Navy, reached the rank of Captain and Head of Naval Nursing Service. Neale is also a qualified nurse. Both Carol and Neale have served terms in Afghanistan and Iraq where they have been part of the Medical Core.

They shared stories of their experiences and opportunities, of what working in foreign countries allowed them to achieve in both their personal and professional lives. The students that they were talking to were gripped and hanging on their every word, as stories of their lives were told with such passion and vigour for what they had achieved, which spilled over to inspire the students to want to pursue careers in Health and Social Care too.

Carol and Neale have both kindly agreed to return and speak to the students once again, to give mock interviews to those that have been offered conditional offers and interviews at universities for places on physiotherapy, midwifery, and paediatric nursing courses.






Year 12 & 13 Theatre Trip

Shenfield Football Enjoying More National Cup Success

The 2023-24 football season was quite remarkable, even by Shenfield High School standards.

To win four national titles on the one day at West Brom FC last May was extraordinary and testament to the hard work put in by our footballers and coaching staff over many years. To try and emulate that success is going to be very difficult but the 2024-25 season has certainly started off in a very positive way.

At Shenfield High School, we try to provide National Cup football opportunities for all A and B teams and even enter the Elite Schools competitions (for schools that have several Academy players in a year group).

This season we entered 20 National Cup competitions for the boys and girls teams (11-18) and, as we approach Christmas, we still remarkably have fifteen of those teams in either the fourth or fifth round of their respective competitions. In fact every girls team U12 - U18 are still unbeaten in their respective competitions, underlining the quality of the girls football at Shenfield High School.

This week our Year 9 boys progressed to the last 32 in the country after a hard fought 1-0 win over Thorpe St Andrews. These two sides met in the last 8 of the competition two years ago and it was always going to be a tough game. Shenfield High School scored through an excellent Tom A left footed strike after 25 minutes and dealt well with the Thorpe St Andrews counter attacks.

In the second half we failed to find the target with some good opportunities and Thorpe grew into the game. Finley C had to pull off several excellent saves while captain Teddy B and central defensive partner Harry F were on fine form to deal with the aerial bombardment that Thorpe looked to use in the last 20 minutes of the game. These boys also play in the last 16 of the Elite Schools Cup next week away in Croydon.

The year 7 boys met Saffron Walden CHS in the last 64 of their National Cup and despite a nervy first half in which Charlie L opened the scoring for Shenfield, the second half really showed this teams quality as they ran out 7-0 winners. Charlie and Harrison C scoring hat-tricks while Archie T scored the goal of the game. They join the U14 and U16 boys in the last 32 in the country.

The girls teams have several fixtures before we break up for Christmas so we hope they can match the boys success in Round 4 so all fifteen teams can enjoy their Christmas break knowing they have some exciting fixtures to look forward to in the New Year.

On an individual level we should also say a special well done to year 9 students Isla F and Jude L. Isla who were due to play in the final England U15 schoolgirls trial when Storm Darragh hit. Best of luck to her for the rescheduled final trial after Christmas.

Jude L, who like Isla plays for West Ham United Academy, was invited to attend an England U15 training camp at St George's Park along with 24 other elite U15 players across England.

Both have tremendous attitudes to their own selfimprovement which is crucial for success in football and in life.
