GETTING TO KNOW AND LOOKING AFTER YOUR CHILD

There are two elements at the heart of the transition from Primary School to Shenfield High School: students' welfare and students' learning. Staff from Shenfield High School will get to know your child while they are in Year 6. There will be opportunities to visit Shenfield as well as time for our staff to visit our local primary schools. As well as Open Evening and Open Mornings, there is also the opportunity for parents to come to a New Entrants' Information Evening.

During the summer holiday the soon-to-be Year 7s are invited to come to various summer camps including a sports camp that has ran for many years. Here they will continue their learning, make new friends, and get to know both the school campus and some of our staff.



Students in Year 7 are organised into Form Groups. They will get to know their Form Tutor, their Pastoral Manager who looks after day-to-day and pastoral concerns, and their Head of Year, who oversees academic progress. Each student also becomes a member of a House. We have four houses: Attenborough, Harry, Nightingale and Parks.

SPORT AND PERFORMING ARTS

We are very proud of particular strengths in both sport and performing arts and we hold Sports Trials and Performing Arts Auditions in October for children applying for admission the following September. THE YEAR 7 CURRICULUM AND KEY STAGE 3

New students in Shenfield will experience a rich and varied curriculum and will be expertly supported in their learning. Every student will become known and known well as a person and as a learner.

In Years 7, 8 and 9, students study the following subjects:

- Art
- Computer Science
- Drama
- Social Sciences including Personal Development and Beliefs & Values
- English

Through lessons and extra-curricular activities, we also focus on transferable skills such as researching, investigating, problem solving, creativity, organisation, working independently, teamwork, underpinned by literacy and numeracy. Developing these essential skills will allow students to feel confident in all other aspects of the curriculum.

KEY STAGE 4

In Key Stage 4 students begin to specialise.

All students study English, Mathematics, Science, PE and Social Sciences which includes Citizenship, RE, Personal, Social and Health Education. Careers guidance is also included.

THE SIXTH FORM

We are proud that as part of our extensive Sixth Form curriculum offer, we also have a Football Academy, Cricket Academy and Performing Arts Academy. These areas of the curriculum represent particular strengths of the school and offer students the opportunity to work at the highest levels of excellence within these fields. Further information about our academies is available from the PE Department and the Drama Department.

As the most senior members of the school community, Shenfield Sixth Formers enjoy a number of privileges such as their own dedicated study space, café and social facilities. Year 12 and Year 13 students also act as role models to younger students and assume a number of responsibilities.

EXCELLENCE IN PERFORMING ARTS

We are very proud of the strengths we have in Performing Arts and pathways are available for students who have a particular interest and talent in these areas.

Students applying for a place at Shenfield High School may also audition for a place in the Junior Performing Arts Academy (JPAA). Auditions will take place on Saturday 14th October 2023. Membership of the JPAA gives access to extra training through workshops and master classes with outside practitioners, audition masterclasses and first allocation for theatre trips.



Students are able to develop their interest and talent in the Performing Arts right the way through to the Sixth Form. In our Sixth Form Performing Arts Academy, students have an opportunity to participate in professional workshops led by drama practitioners. Students also have timetabled hours to study acting skills such as voice and speech, characterisation, movement, dance and sessions on physical theatre, devising, working from a script and Improvisation. The Academy is designed for students taking performing arts subjects at A Level/BTEC Level 3 or for students who are prepared to make a serious commitment alongside other Sixth Form courses.

EXCELLENCE IN SPORT

Shenfield High School is very proud of its consistently outstanding standards in sport and exceptional extra-curricular success.

Students applying for a place at Shenfield High School may also attend trials for a place in the Junior Sports Academy (JSA). Trials will take place on Saturday 14th October 2023. Our Junior Sports Academy will enable students to pursue their sporting interests and develop their talents. The JSA provides significant extra time to help develop the athlete's skills and fitness, giving access to an Athlete Mentoring Programme, strength and conditioning, advanced coaching, fitness testing data analysis and parent-student athlete information evenings. Our facilities include a well-equipped gymnasium, an indoor heated swimming pool, a sports hall large enough to accommodate five badminton courts and with indoor cricket nets. We also have a 'third generation' artificial grass pitch, a new sports pavilion with classroom area and a strength and conditioning facility. Outside, the extensive playing fields are marked out to include one rugby, four football pitches and training areas. These facilities combined with the school's reputation for football success helped us establish a Football Academy in 2010 and Cricket Academy in 2012.

The Shenfield Football Academy provides elite level football coaching and development for Year 12 and Year 13 male and female students. The 2-year course consists of 6 hours a week of coaching from UEFA qualified coaches as well as regular matches in the prestigious English Colleges Premier League. The Football Academy is also very proud of our former students who have gone on to play professional football (Sean Clare, Chalton AFC, Max Watters Cardiff City FC, Taryn Allarakhia Crawley Town FC, Frankie Kent Peterborough United FC) and many have gone on to study degree courses both in the UK and the USA alongside football scholarships. Overseas tours occur on a biennial basis and provide an exciting opportunity to learn of the huge scholarship opportunities available for talented footballers at American Colleges. Shenfield Football Academy for Girls, in association with the London Lionesses, was set up and welcomed its first participants in September 2020. In their first season they reached the National Cup semi-final and this programme works closely with other professional football clubs to support their schedules.

Shenfield's football programme from U12-18 has become one of the most successful of its type anywhere in the country, reaching 11 National cup finals since 2015, including winning 7 National football titles in the last 8 years with 3 girls and 4 boys National titles.

Shenfield's reputation for excellence in cricket is also on a National level. The school has been recognised as a Top 100 school for cricket in each of the last 6 years, one of only two state schools on that list. On the back of this recognition we have been awarded

a fixture every year with the MCC since 2018. The Shenfield Cricket Academy train all year round and enjoy a biennial overseas tour having played in Cape Town in 2015 and 2017 and toured Barbados in 2019. We are fortunate that ex Shenfield High students Matthew Salisbury (Durham CCC) and Mady Villiers (England Women's Cricket squad) come back to help coach within our programme and support Catherine Dalton (Essex CCC and Ireland, Level 3 coach) who is the lead coach alongside Director of Sport Garry Sapsford. The SCA played 15 games in the 2023 season including five U17 National Cup fixtures on the way to the last 16. The younger cricket teams also enjoyed significant success with two teams reaching Essex Cup finals with the U15 girls being crowned Indoor Cricket County Champions in 2023.

Comprehensive fixtures for Shenfield High School teams are organised for all major sports. In recent years, our football, futsal, cricket, basketball, rugby, netball, tennis, athletics, trampolining and rounders' teams have enjoyed considerable success. To evidence this fact Shenfield teams have won 16 National titles in a range of sports since 2002. A large number of Shenfield High School students have also been awarded county and national honours in their respective sports with some going on to professional sporting careers. The extensive extra-curricular programme provides excellent opportunities for regular practice at morning, lunch and after school training every day. All students who aspire to maximise their potential in a vast range of sports are therefore provided with the opportunity to be the best they can be. This is a key reason for our considerable success in district, county and national sporting competitions. Maximising Participation: For those students seeking a less competitive environment we have run a hugely successful 'Rec Night' club where students come along and try their hand in a range of sports. From swimming, trampolining to badminton and table tennis, it is a great way to socialise and exercise with friends in a relaxed warm environment.

In every sense Shenfield PE is dedicated to fulfilling its aim of 'Maximising Participation and Developing Excellence'.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Lessons are crucial but at Shenfield High School we believe that our students' experience of school should extend beyond the classroom.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

There are a wide variety of clubs – art, book club, cricket, drama, enterprise groups, futsal, gardening club...rampaging chariots, rocket-building, singing, trampolining, ukulele...almost everything you can think of from A to Z (almost!) Choirs, orchestras, bands and ensembles take place every day of the week before school, at lunchtime and after school. There are many opportunities to perform both at our regular concerts and musicals and in the community. Students may also learn a musical instrument with our peripatetic staff. We also have a fantastic reputation for producing splendid shows, the most recent being 'Our House', 'Shrek' and 'Anything Goes'.

We encourage our students to get involved in the community, both in school and beyond our gates. Shenfield High School students are well known for their enterprise and frequently get involved in raising money for local, national and international charities.

COMBINED CADET FORCE (CCF)

Shenfield High School CCF is a combined cadet force that invites students entering into Year 9 to join our Army section.

The CCF promotes the cadet core values of personal responsibility, leadership and self-discipline, enabling our students to gain key skills and self-confidence to reach their full potential at school and beyond, including employment.

Activities include; drill, skill at arms, shooting, field craft, first aid and adventure training. By joining the CCF cadets also have the opportunity to get involved

with volunteer and charitable work in the community to gain nationally recognised qualifications such as the Duke of Edinburgh's award and BTECs.



Joining the CCF provides a wonderful and unique opportunity to take part in exciting Army themed training and events, all which focus on the cadet core values.

We are proud to say that Shenfield High School is the biggest state contingent CCF nationally and the model on which future CCF's will be based on. We currently have 170 cadets across Yr 9 – 13 which is continuing to grow.

BUILDING POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS

Good relationships are essential to Shenfield High School because we are a community of people - staff and students - working and living together during the school day.

All members of the school are expected to help create an atmosphere conducive to learning, with courtesy and respect as a basic requirement. Good and appropriate behaviour is supported by school policies.



UNIFORM

We have a very smart uniform for all students in Year 7 to Year 11 and in the Sixth Form. We expect all our students to be appropriately and smartly dressed and be good ambassadors at all times. Our uniform requirements are available on our website.

A PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS

We encourage parents to become fully involved in the education of their children. Students and parents enter into a partnership agreement on joining our school which symbolises the joint approach to school and parents working together for the benefit of the young people in our care. Contact between parents and teachers is very important and there will be regular opportunities to meet teachers and discuss your child's work, attitude to learning and progress. Throughout the year there are occasions when teachers, parents and students can come together informally such as concerts, drama productions, sporting and social events. Links and relationships between parents and school are also strengthened through informative guidance and presentation evenings, regular newsletters.
